Proposed Wording of Position for Official Publication: The Section supports Legislation and/or Regulatory action which establishes certainty as to the documentary stamp taxes due with regard to any debt forgiveness in connection with a short sale and which provides accurate sale price information for use by tax assessors and private property appraisers.

Reasons For Proposed Advocacy: There is uncertainty as to whether documentary stamps are payable on the amount of forgiven indebtedness on a short sale is part of the consideration subject to documentary stamps. Paying stamps on this amount, without clarification of the "actual" selling price will result in the illusion of a higher value. As doc stamps are one of the primary sources of information relied on by County and private property appraisers this runs the risk of unjustifiably increasing ad valorem taxes, and private appraised valuations, increasing the potential for mortgage fraud and delaying the ultimate resolution of the current mortgage crisis.
