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## **Proposed Wording of Position for Official Publication:**

"Support amendment of the Florida Trust Code to add new provisions limiting certain trustee fiduciary duties with respect to policies of insurance on the life of the settlor if the limitations are consented to by the settlor or the qualified beneficiaries of the trust; support amendment of F.S. s. 518.112 to harmonize notice procedures under that statute with notice procedures in the Florida Probate Code and the Florida Trust Code."

## **Reasons for Proposed Advocacy:**

The proposed legislation would limit certain fiduciary duties with respect to a policy of insurance on the life of the settlor. The limitations would apply only in the case of a policy owned by the trust where the settlor and/or the settlor's spouse is or are paying the policy premiums. In this instance, the policy of insurance is normally selected and carried (through paying the required premiums) by the settlor, and the settlor desires the trustee simply to continue the settlor's arrangement. The proposed legislation would only apply if the settlor or the qualified beneficiaries consent to its application; otherwise, the trustee has all of the normally-applicable fiduciary duties as to the policy. The proposed amendments to F.S. 518.112 are to make changes required by the enactment of these provisions as additions to the Florida Trust Code, and to make the procedures for notice of delegation under the statute identical to those under the Florida Probate Code and the Florida Trust Code.
